In recognition of the 30th anniversary of the Congress for the New Urbanism, the CNU Board of Directors has authorized a process for CNU to propose amendments to our foundational set of principles – the CNU Charter.

Prior to submitting an amendment, please read the <u>FAQs</u> about the reasons motivating this process. All submissions are due December 3, 2023. You must be a current CNU Member to submit an amendment.

Please note that submitted separate amendments on the same topic may be asked to work together to integrate submissions.

Please submit the exact language of your proposed Charter Amendment.

Submissions must be written in the linguistic style of the original Charter. The amendment may not exceed 50 words.

5. Please select the geographical scale that your Charter Amendment most closely applies to.

6. Please explain the rationale of the scale chosen (or explain its relevance across all scales)

7. Explanatory Abstract

Please upload a PDF or Word document of your explanatory abstract. 200 WORDS MAX.

The abstract outlines what will be expanded into a full essay further into the amendment process. The full essay must describe the reasoning and motivation behind your amendment and explain and justify why this amendment is needed. In addition, the essay must discuss the ways in which the principle is actionable.

Please also include in the PDF any embedded imagery that supports or reinforces your proposal.

8. Please share any additional references, sources, or other supporting material that informed your Charter Amendment proposal.
